## 5. General Education

All courses should be registered by students themselves through CUSIS. Please take reference to the recommendation by your major department and make sure there is enough course load when planning your course schedule in both terms.

### GEYS1010 - Creative Social Responsibility and Sustainable Development (First Year)

Time: Fridays (3:30pm – 6:15pm)

(This course will be offered in both terms.)

#### Course details:

This course consists of four major components:

#### 1. Our Roles for a Sustainable Future

How can we lead a good life in a just society? How can individual actions affect events at a global scale? These are the questions every student should ask and take seriously. We will explore them through the United Nation's 17 Sustainable Development Goals (SDG) in this section of the course.

#### 2. Sustainable Development for Our Future

This section of the course seeks to help students to think about what their future is going to be like if humanity continues business-as-usual. Selected issues that critically impact the future of our planet will be discussed. In-depth discussion on the issues, including responses from various sectors of the society around the world, will be guided by the SDG Framework.

#### 3. Sustainable Development of Cities and Communities to Ensure Good Health and Well-being

This section of the course enhances students' knowledge on impact of urban development on health and well-being by making use of concept of Healthy City to illustrate socio-economic and political determinants of health. It aims to broaden the students' concept of health and well-being to address issues of sustainable urban development. This section focuses on 2 key SDG's, Good Health and Well-being (SDG 3) and Sustainable Cities and Communities (SDG 11). Other determinants for health and well-being, such as reduction of poverty (SDG 1) and reduction of inequality (SDG 10), and health justice (SDG 16), will also be discussed.

#### 4. Creativity and Design Thinking for a Sustainable Future

This section of the course examines the topic of creativity and design thinking. The key question to be discussed is how we can put design creativity to good use in our everyday life as well as in projects that we choose to pursue to create a world of peace and prosperity.

Lectures are supplemented by a variety of activities to enhance students' exposure to related topics discussed in class, including cultural walk, movie appreciation and more. Students could register for their desired activities at term start.

### GEJC1020 – The Hong Kong Story (First Year)

*\*For non-Cantonese speaking students only*

Time: Fridays (3:30pm – 6:15pm)

(The course is offered in **term one ONLY**.)

#### Course details:

From the crown jewel of the British Empire to the SAR of the PRC, the Hong Kong story has undergone many ups and downs, twists and turns. Designed from a sociological perspective, but specifically for students without sociological background or much background knowledge about Hong Kong, this course shall guide them through the journey of Hong Kong and its people so far. It will pick up popular images about Hong Kong, such as "a laissez-faire economic miracle", "the safest place in the world", or "the land of opportunity", evaluating their validities or tracing their origins and implications.

Integrating experiential learning and e-learning strategies, this course should offer students a range of new learning experiences and new angles of approaching the society that we are living in.

### ELTU2008 – Service-Learning: The Spirit of Hong Kong (First Year)

*\*For non-Cantonese speaking students only*

Time: Fridays (3:30pm – 6:15pm)

#### Course details:

Through engaging in local services, students would have the opportunity to holistically participate and ethically discuss a wide range of social issues in Hong Kong. This course allows students to contribute to the local community while enhancing the understanding of Hong Kong's diverse culture, social issues and history. It also empowers students to reflect on how their actions may positively impact the global and local community in preparation for them becoming a global citizen.

Students will spend 14-20 hours in the community with one of the partner organizations over the course of the semester and learn to create an infographic poster highlighting the companies impact on Hong Kong society. At term-end, students will present their experience and learning in the service-learning journey.

# 12. House of Sunny Living

The establishment of “House of Sunny Living” is Wu Yee Sun College’s initiative for promotion of healthy living style. It aims to transform our students into a **positive and radiating energy force to make the world a better place**. Our whole person approach starts with helping students to **discover their passions, dreams and sense of purpose in life** so that they can **form their own identity** and develop **a character of integrity and perseverance**.

The House adopts a holistic three-pronged community approach by integrating three dimensions of “health and spiritual well-being”, “sports for life” and “go green and lead the society” to target the well-being of the body, mind and spirit of our students and encourage their contributions to the environment and society.

## Health and Spiritual Well-being

Relaxation workshops such as zendala workshop and mindfulness practice designed for strengthening and training for mind and body can be found here. You can also learn to eat wisely through joining our healthy cooking class.

## Sports for Life

Diversified sports activities such as Yoga Class, Table Tennis Challenge and Sunny Relay Race are offered to promote healthy living and sports fun. To motivate students to establish routine exercise practice, certified fitness trainers are stationed at our gymnasium to provide personal fitness advice and lead fitness class.

## Go Green and Lead the Society

# 14. Funding Schemes

**College provides various funding schemes for YOU to initiate your own Projects!**

## **Be Entrepreneurial! Funding Scheme (「創出我天地！」學生資助計劃)**

The funding scheme supports short-term student projects that will realize the College's core values of creativity, entrepreneurial spirit and social responsibility, with a maximum funding amount up to HK\$20,000. All College students, regardless of discipline and year of study, are welcome to submit application all year round.

## **Dorsett Young Entrepreneur Scholarship(帝盛青年創業家獎學金)**

Dorsett Young Entrepreneur Scholarship aims at providing students, who are year 2 or above and preferably have exposure to Mainland China, an opportunity to demonstrate entrepreneurial talents with innovative ideas to set-up their own business, targeting Hong Kong and/or the Mainland China market. Awardee will be offered up to HK\$80,000, which is subjected to the total number of applications per year.

## **Global Learning Award Scheme (寰宇學習獎勵計劃)**

The scheme supports Wu Yee Sun College students to take part in or self-initiate short-term (less than a month) and long-term (more than one month but less than six months) academic or experiential learning programmes outside Hong Kong, such as academic conferences, competitions, field trips, language programmes, cultural tours and so on. The maximum award to successful short-term applicants is HK\$12,000 or 50-100% of particular items, whichever is lower; to successful long-term applicants is HK\$15,000 or 100% of particular items, whichever is lower.

## **Rance Lee Award for Creativity**

Creativity and Sunny Living are two of the College's central forces. In order to enhance the development and interaction among our students, Rance Lee Award for Creativity has been established to promote the creativity for Sunny Living in the following three areas, (a) Health and Spiritual Well-being, (b) Lifetime Sports and (c) Green Life. Awardee in each area will be offered up to HK\$10,000. Take action and live up the Sunny Living attitude!





### **Self-Motivation Fund for Sports Activities / Health and Well-being Activities / Sustainability Activities (「自選遊」體育 / 身心靈健康 / 可持續發展活動資助計劃)**

The Self-Motivation Funds encourage students to participate in various kinds of sports activities / health and well-being activities / green activities in order to instill positive energy and promote sustainable living. Up to 60% or \$1,500 (whichever lower) of the course and application fees will be subsidized to support students to join activities organized by organizations other than the College.

- 1) You are welcome to speak with our **College Dean of Students, Associate Deans of Students and Wardens** when you have problems that need resolving.
- 2) You may also approach the University's **Student Wellness and Counseling Centre** at **3943 7208** for help.
- 3) A **24-hour Emotional Support Hotline** at **5400 2055** is launched to assist all CUHK full-time students in need of emotional help. The hotline is operated by trained counsellors from Christian Family Service Centre which offers telephone counselling and crisis interventions. You are welcome to call when facing emotional distress and critical situations.
- 4) (Chinese Only) **賽馬會心導遊計劃**提供網上自助心理支援平台，同學可登記成為會員，進行簡單的心理健康評估。平台會根據評每個人的個別需要而建議合適的課程或服務。只要每日抽少少時間參與平台上的課程，就可以隨時隨地提升自己的心理健康。
- 5) **Sunshine at CUHK Campaign** aims to foster an atmosphere of warmth and mutual care on campus. Under the campaign, all CUHK members are invited to become "CU Angels" by hanging out a sign to tell the students around them that they are willing and ready to listen to their troubles.






# 17. Important Reminders

## Academic Honesty

CUHK places very high importance on honesty in academic work submitted by students, and adopts a policy of zero tolerance on academic dishonesty.

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- **Plagiarism.** Use the work of others as one's own without acknowledgement. No exception for group projects!
  - **Undeclared multiple submissions**
  - **Employing or using services provided by a third party** to undertake ones' submitted work, or providing services as a third party
  - **Distribution/Sharing/Copying of teaching materials without the consent** of the course teachers to gain unfair academic advantage in the courses
  - **Violating rules** of the University's Examination or the University's Online Examination
  - **Cheating** in tests and examinations
  - **Impersonation fraud** in tests and examinations
  - All other acts of academic dishonesty
