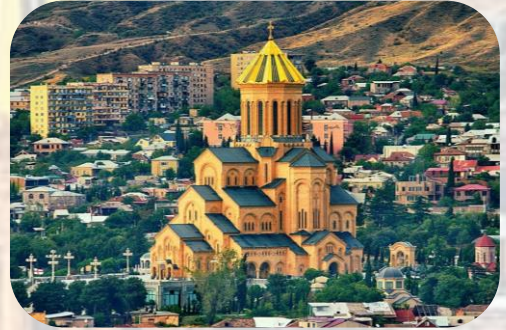

# Risk Assessment and Contingency Plan

## Risk 1: Health Risks

Georgia's diverse landscape includes high-altitude regions where travelers might experience altitude-related issues. There is a potential for food or waterborne illnesses due to contaminated sources. Insect-borne diseases like tick-borne encephalitis could also pose a risk.

Mitigation: Before the trip, seek advice from healthcare professionals regarding vaccinations and medications for altitude sickness. Consume only bottled or treated water and avoid raw or undercooked foods. Carry essential medical supplies, insect repellent, and wear protective clothing to prevent insect bites. In case of illness, seek assistance from the nearest medical facility and your travel insurance provider.

## Risk 2: Safety Risks

Certain areas in Georgia, such as crowded tourist spots or markets, may have incidents of petty crimes like pickpocketing. Road safety is crucial, especially on poorly maintained roads outside major cities.

Mitigation: Stay alert in crowded places and refrain from displaying expensive items or carrying large amounts of cash. Opt for reputable transportation services and always use seat belts while traveling. If you fall victim to theft, report the incident to local authorities and your travel insurance provider. Maintain copies of essential documents in a secure place.

## Risk 3: Natural Risks

Georgia is susceptible to natural phenomena like sudden weather changes, potentially leading to flight disruptions or cancellations. Sandstorms and unpredictable weather patterns, including rain or snow in certain seasons, are factors to consider.

Mitigation: Stay updated on weather forecasts and be aware of any flight changes or cancellations due to adverse conditions like sandstorms. Keep a dust mask and eye protection handy in case of a sandstorm. In emergencies arising from natural disasters, follow directives from local authorities and find shelter in a secure location.
